In July, we received our Certificate of Occupancy, began working on-site, and launched our hold pick-up service just days later. In July and August, we welcomed over 300 people for socially distanced, self-guided tours. While all of this was going on, we also worked to put in place the policies, protocols, and procedures needed to meet the Governor's sector guidelines for public libraries (full information on this is available at scrantonlibrary.org). On September 16th we met those guidelines and were able to open to the public Mon - Sat by appointment.

EAST RIVER READING ROOM - YOUR TICKET TO TIME TRAVEL!

There are many ways to travel back to when Madison was a smaller place. One is to visit the new East River Reading Room in the Scranton Library. Madison is unique as are all places; when visiting the ERRR you will find all the features of a collection that sets Madison apart. On the back wall you will see Horace Washburn, flanked by his wife Sarah Munger Washburn and the by-laws of the East River Library and Reading Room Association. On the left wall are the framed "View of Madison 1881," donated by the Madison Lions Club, and above the bookcases are twelve men of literary fame, framed in bas relief and done by Ralph Goddard. On the right wall are a framed photo that appeared in the September 1900 issue of the "Brickbuilder," and a framed poster of an auction held Mon eve Dec. 4, 1871 at the Boston Street School House.

But wait! There's more! The collection contains books, including city directories and Daniel Hand High School yearbooks, Connecticut state and town histories. Also, there are Local History files and Scranton Library history files. There are also albums of postcards, "Madison Now and Then" slide sets and many photographs. All materials are for use in the Library only, but we are happy to help you find what you would like to see in the East River Reading Room, made possible by the East River Library Company.
