RECONSTRUCTION BEGINS AT 20 WALL STREET

20 Wall Street, also known as The Old Post Office, sits on Scranton Library property adjacent to the library parking lot. In early 2023 a fire damaged both the interior of the building and the roof. Now, reconstruction has begun, with the hope that the house will be usable by summer of 2024.

J. Myron Hull, one of the first land developers along Madison's shoreline, built the house for his commercial real estate business in 1897. J. Myron Hull also operated as postmaster in this building. He and his wife, Sarah Frances Willard, lived next door at 24 Wall Street, the house that is currently next to The Old Post Office. Originally facing Wall Street, 20 Wall Street has been moved twice; first in the 1920's and again during the library renovation and expansion in 2019.

With reconstruction in progress, we ask drivers to please be mindful in the parking lot. There might be a temporary new addition (the dumpster!) depending on what work is being done.
